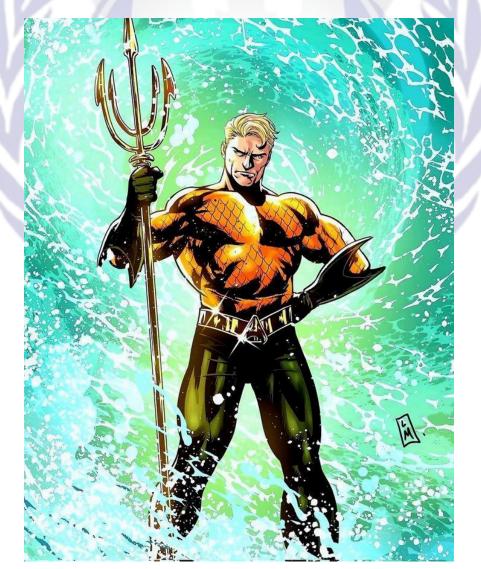


6. AQUAMAN

Nightwing is a symbol of growth and independence, showing that it's possible to move beyond one's origins and make a new path while still standing up for what's right.

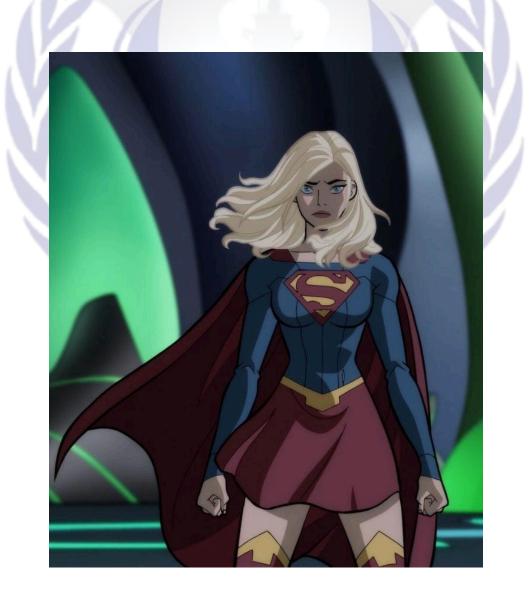


13. <u>SUPERGIRL</u>

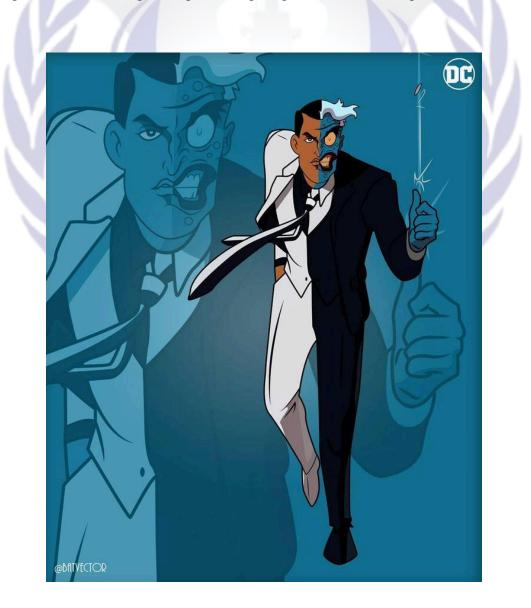

27. <u>SCARECROW</u>

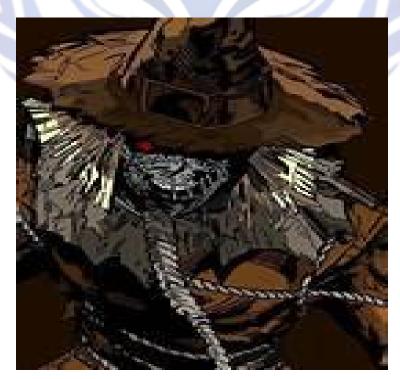

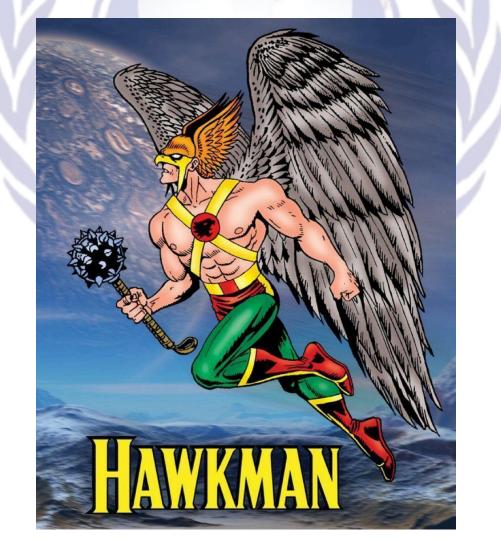

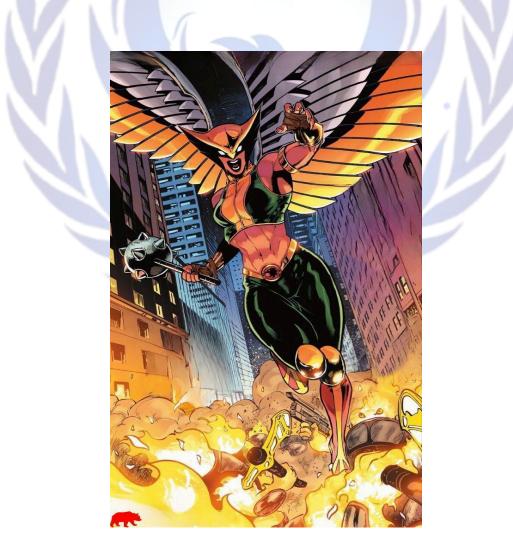


38. <u>HAWKGIRL</u>

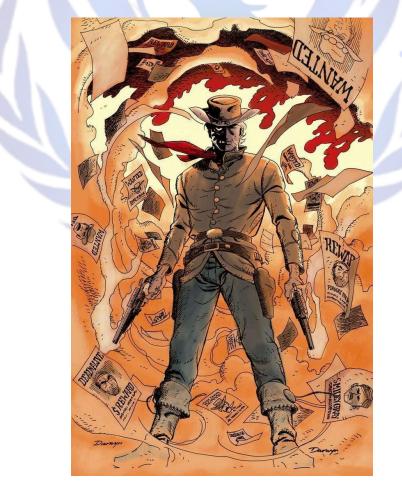
42. <u>JONAH HEX</u>
